ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Norfolk Christian Schools operates on a semester system with four nine-week quarters over the course of a year. We utilize an A/B eight-block schedule where eight classes are taught over a two day (A/B Day) period, four blocks each day. Mid-Year grades are automatically sent to all colleges in January; Final transcripts will be sent to each student's final choice college in mid-June.

ACT INFORMATION

Of the 46 students in the Class of 2022, 6 students (13%) took the ACT. The middle-50% range was 22-26 and the average was 23 for the best-test composite score.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to earn at least 24 credits, which includes a mandatory requirement of one Bible class per semester each year they are at NCS. Listed below are the minimum subject requirements. Most students will choose to pursue a recommended college admission path, which includes a foreign language package, three lab sciences, and a math above Algebra II.

Senior Capstone, worth .25 credits, is a year-long endeavor that includes a service component, a summary report, and a formal presentation. It is currently under administrative review and is not required for the Class of 2023.
