Norfolk Christian, an international leader among Christian schools, is known for exceptional college preparatory academics and an unwavering Christ-centered curriculum. Differentiated instruction focuses on each student's strengths and needs. Formative and summative assessments combine to track learning progress and ensure subject and skill mastery. Manage the school's annual fund and work closely with the Head of School to achieve the school's overall annual revenue goals. Develop and implement strategies to attract new major individual donors. Lead research on prospective donors, grants, and new funding initiatives. Work with our foundation partner in procuring tax credit donors to fund need based tuition scholarships.

### Grow Major Gifts, Planned Giving, and the Endowment

Actively participate in leadership gift solicitations; manage a portfolio of prospective individual donors and cultivate, steward, and deepen relationships with existing donors. Analyze and bolster the school's major gift program via the identification, cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship of prospects and donors. Strengthen the school's planned giving program.

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### **The Position**

#### Responsibilities

#### **Leadership and Management:**

- Inspire and manage two Development Officers ensuring that future staff are properly hired, trained, supported, and guided, and that their professional development is nurtured.
- Manage, cultivate, and support parent volunteer networks.
- Serve on the school's senior administrative team and lead or participate in several other committees.
- Produce Board reports, presentations and attend meetings.
- Manage Development Office budget.
- Oversee data management policies for the Development Office, including privacy, accuracy, reports, best practices, gift entry, reconciliation, surveys, paperwork, etc.

#### **Community Participation:**

- Lead and oversee annual community, parent, alumni, and fundraising events.
- Oversees the coordination of all fundraising at Norfolk Christian (i.e. Boosters, Parent Teacher Fellowship, student clubs, missions, etc.) so that all fundraising asks are understood and approved by the Advancement Office.
- Publicly represent the school in a positive and proactive way, collaborating with alumni, parents, other local institutions, and neighbors.
- Contribute where needed to interact with families and students (parking lot duty, Back to School Night, concerts, athletic events, etc.).

- A motivational communicator, both written and verbal, who is effective in 1-on-1 and group settings, as well as equally engaging with internal and external audiences.
- Knowledge of and proficiency in Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Google Docs, and familiarity with CRM donor database programs.
- Ability to cultivate and build strong and organic relationships with both the school and greater Hampton Roads community.

# Royal, King of the Ambassadors

During the school's founding, Norfolk Christian students became known as "Ambassadors," a name inspired by the school verse, 2 Corinthians 5:20. The school later struggled to find a fitting mascot until the late 1990s when Athletic Director Rich Rose adopted the lion as an appropriate symbol for the school. It wasn't until 2018, however, that the current face of the lion was created, and at that point, students gave him the name so beloved today, "Royal."

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### The School

### **History**

In the early 1950s, Reverend John Dunlap, Pastor of Tabernacle Church of Norfolk, felt called to start a Christian School. One of only six Christian schools in Virginia at the time. Norfolk Christian Grammar School was born in 1952, with 76 students, five staff members, and a budget of \$13,070. In 1953, Pastor Gene Garrick joined as the first NCS principal and the strong partnership between these two Godly men began. Under their leadership, Norfolk Christian grew to 350 students over the next decade. A new High School was built on Thole Street in 1959, and an inaugural class of ten graduates received their diplomas in 1963. Always on the forefront of Christian education, Drs. Dunlap and Garrick pursued curricular and program excellence and encouraged other Christian schools around the country to do the same. Their strong commitment to global missions became a hallmark of the NCS Ambassador Experience and formed the basis of the school's steadfast commitment to evangelism. Now, more than 70 years later, Norfolk Christian's mission remains the same: to send students into the world who love God and are equipped to be Ambassadors for Christ, wherever He may take them. Dr. Dunlap's humble vision has produced a landmark institution with an international reputation for nurturing exceptional students with hearts for evangelism.

#### **Christian Mission**

Ambassadorship is a key component to the mission of NCS. An ambassador is sent by a person in authority to represent and share a message. Ambassadors for Christ are sent by Jesus to represent Him and share His message with the world. True ambassadors must know their Sender and His Message. They must be prepared to communicate in relevant, personal ways to build bridges and make connections—between academic curricula and the gospel, between believers and nonbelievers, and between faith and everyday life. Being an NCS "Ambassador" means much more than identifying with the school's sports team mascot. Creating and training ambassadors for Christ is the heart of the school's mission, the basis of all areas of study, communication, and events.

teaching and learning—and using them to equip Ambassadors for Christ. Rigorous state and national standards are minimum guides for instruction. Teachers weave and connect God's redemptive story throughout the curriculum, encouraging students to see that their own stories—their unique gifts, talents, and challenges—fit into His greater narrative and play an important part in building His Kingdom.

On the Lower School Campuses, differentiation and integrated Deeper Learning practices are at the core of academic instruction. In recent years, The CAFE/Daily Five framework and Word Study, through the combined use of Word Journeys and Words Their Way, were implemented for Language Arts. In Math classes, teachers use The Daily Three math rotations and IXL Diagnostic software.

Middle School focuses on transitions. The sixth-grade faculty team meets yearly with the lower school's fifth-grade teachers and administration to support students' smooth next steps. Teacher-directed use of planners, binders, and

accordion folders help develop students' executive functioning skills, which are then reinforced during the advisory block at the end of each school day. Math skills are strengthened with such technological resources as IXL, Khan Academy, and math games in class. The language arts curriculum includes diagnostic tools. Eighth grade vocabulary study includes Latinroot curriculum to prepare students for high school English as well as world languages.

At the High School, rigorous college preparation is the priority. Students can take a full range of honors courses, as well as 13 Advanced Placement (AP) classes. Newer offerings include Environmental Science and Sports Medicine, with real-world applications that develop problem-solving skills. In Makerspace—combining elements science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics—students are exposed to 3D-design software and advanced technology and learn about manufacturing and production as well as finance and entrepreneurship.

Each high school teacher strikes an essential balance between supporting students' efforts and demanding they take ownership of their learning. Teachers provide an effective framework: detailed lesson plans, clear objectives, shared agenda. Classroom technology, such as one-to-one Chromebooks, enhances collaboration. Diversified instruction appeals to visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learners—through cooperative learning, lectures, debates, and Socratic Seminars. Teachers are knowledgeable in their respective subject areas, and they hold high expectations of their students. They share excellent resources and a true passion to see students learn and grow.

#### **Arts and Athletics**

The athletics program supports Norfolk Christian's mission well. Three-quarters of NCS Upper School students participate on at least one of 30 teams that compete in the TCIS Conference. The NCS coaching staff is one of the area's strongest. Coaches hold themselves to the highest standards as representatives of NCS and members of the body of Christ. NCS coaches accept the responsibility of leading student- athletes by a godly example and mentoring – spiritually as well as athletically. NCS trains all coaches in the Fellowship of Christian Athlete's 3-Dimensional Coaching curriculum, which goes beyond skill building to transforming student-athletes'

lives by capturing their hearts. As they train young men and women to excel at their sports, coaches nurture relationships among teammates and help them grow in their relationships with Christ. Recently, NCS added a state-of-the-art football/ soccer/lacrosse turf field that serves as the campus "front porch," welcoming guests throughout the community.

The arts can reflect God's aesthetic nature and move hearts to praise and worship Him. At NCS, a variety of visual, musical, and dramatic programs, both curricular and co-curricular, offer avenues for artistic exploration and expression. The Arts program is geared to all age groups and combines theory with practical application, culminating in performances open to the NCS family and the public.

### **Christian Deeper Learning**

In June 2016, eleven faculty members, representing both lower school campuses, attended a week-long **Deeper Learning Institute** in Andover, MA. Steven Levy, a CACE (Center for the Advancement of Christian Education) Senior Fellow Member and EL Education consultant, immersed teachers in the **Deeper Learning and Expeditionary Learning** practices, which are rooted in project-based learning and community outreach. Since then, teachers have begun developing expeditions at each grade level, with guidance from Steven and his team. They integrate multiple subjects and engage students in authentic learning, posing real problems for them to solve. Teachers document their expeditions in a consistent format that includes standard-aligned learning targets, biblical principles, field work, field experts, and final products.

**Christian Deeper Learning** helps children flourish with minds for wonder, wisdom, and work. They discover God's creation and respond with awe, worship, and stewardship, seeking to live wisely and with discernment as demonstrated through the counter-cultural life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

Christian Deeper Learning is more than personalized or differentiated instruction. It is not about the learner; it is about God on His throne. Deeper (or Deepest) Learning describes what Norfolk Christian desires for its students. Norfolk Christian seeks congruence between seeing Christ as the Tree of Life in whom all knowledge and wisdom comes together, and honoring students as His image-bearers. Traditional practices at Christian schools sometimes fail to engage and promote God-given joy in learning, to celebrate the connectedness in creation, to encourage meaningful service, or to help students discover their God-given gifts and callings. At NCS, Deeper Learning brings congruence between philosophy/theology and practice.

#### **Campuses**

The campus for High School (grades 9-12) and Middle School (grades 6-8) is on the school's original location at 255 Thole Street in Norfolk. While they share a building, the Middle and High Schools have their own dedicated spaces. This state- of-the-art campus includes an indoor and outdoor athletic complex and most administrative offices.

Located at 7000 Granby Street, the Norfolk Lower School serves students in PK3 through 5th grade and is a short walk from the Upper School campus. NCS has a second lower school campus located in Virginia Beach. The Beach Campus is known for its warm, strong community and ease of access for Virginia Beach households. An available bus travels from this campus to the Upper School and back each day for families with students in multiple grades. No matter which campus, an NCS student will find challenging academics and caring teachers committed to nurturing their intellect and spirit.

## **The Community**

Nestled along the Chesapeake Bay, Norfolk, Virginia seamlessly integrates rich history with metropolitan flair. Historic sites like the USS Wisconsin and the Moses Myers House offer glimpses into the past, while the cobblestone streets of the Freemason District exude historic charm.
